YOUR LETTER DATED: January 29, 1997

REQUEST FOR COMMODITY JURISDICTION DETERMINATION FOR: 1) "Standard" single-use model rocket motors which contain no more than 62.5 grams of propellant per motor, 2) "Standard" reloadable model rocket motors and reload kits and "Easy Access" reloadable high power rocket motors and reload kits which use one or more propellant modules containing no more than 62.5 grams of propellant per module, 3) "Restricted Access" reloadable high power rocket motors and reload kits which use propellant modules containing greater than 62.5 grams but no more than 1398 grams of propellant per module, 4) "Restricted Access" single-use high power motors which contain greater than 62.5 grams but no more than 1398 grams of propellant per motor.

Your commodity jurisdiction (CJ) request was referred to the Departments of Commerce and Defense for their review and recommendations. As a result, the Department of State has determined that the referenced commodities are not subject to the licensing jurisdiction of the Department of State. However, the export of the commodities may require authorization from the Department of Commerce. Please consult that agency's Technical Information Support Division at (202) 482-4905 to determine their requirements prior to export.

This jurisdictional determination is for the end items listed above and does not apply to the individual USML controlled propellants such as AP.
